The Story of Sidemen

The name Sidemen is believed to originate from the phrase "Sidha Mahan," which means "a spiritual ability or supernatural power that can be attained." The term "Sidha" or "Siddhi" refers to spiritual abilities or supernatural powers, while "Mahan" implies something that can be acquired or blessed. Historically, Sidemen was considered a place where people sought spiritual or supernatural experiences through learning and meditation. This reputation persists, as Sidemen is known for having the highest concentration of priests and priestesses on the island of Bali. The village is surrounded by the homes of priests and has historically been the home village of many members of the Brahmana clan, who have since spread throughout Bali, Lombok, Sumbawa, and other parts of Indonesia. The serene and picturesque surroundings of Sidemen Village have made it an ideal location for establishing meditation centers.

When visiting Sidemen, one can savor the signature dishes that have been meticulously passed down through generations to preserve the village's rich culture and traditions. A notable dish is Tipat Tlengis, a rice cake served with the dregs of coconut oil and a hint of peanut sauce, available at local warungs throughout Sidemen Village. In addition to its culinary delights, Sidemen is renowned among the Balinese for being a leading producer of traditional palm toddy, known as tuak. This product is often further refined into arak, a palm wine. Cottage industries dedicated to the production of these beverages are widespread throughout the village.

A great souvenir to take home from Sidemen is the villagers' traditional dye weavings, known as songket and endek. The heritage textiles are praised for their intricate motifs and use of colorful hand-loomed cotton or silk threads. Silk items are naturally on the higher side of the price range.

ENCHANTING places to explore



Gembleng Waterfall

A hidden natural attraction located in the Sidemen area. This waterfall is known for its cascading waters that flow into a series of natural rock pools, creating a serene and picturesque setting. Takes about ±30 minutes from Wapa di Ume Sidemen and the best time to visit is during the afternoon.



Bukit Putung

This spot offers stunning panoramic views of the surrounding landscape, including the lush valleys, terraced rice fields, Padang Bay harbour and the distant Indian Ocean. It is a popular destination for tourists and photographers due to its picturesque setting and tranquil atmosphere. 
Samsara Living Museum

Samsara is about the stages of life, characterized by various ceremonies and traditional rituals that lead to the belief in the task of living as humans in repeated births to perfection in Hindus. This museum is a warm and open space that will guide any visitors to enjoy and experience the beauty, wealth and to celebrate the cultural values inherited from ancestors and presents them through love and joy.



Pura Taman Tirta Telaga Tawang

"Tirta" means holy water. It was established as a place of purification and spiritual rejuvenation, where devotees come to bathe in its sacred waters, believed to cleanse the soul and bring blessings. Visitors will experience serene beauty as they descend appx. 300 steps to the temple, surrounded by lush gardens and a beautiful small river flowing in front of the temple.



Jagasatru Waterfall

This picturesque waterfall cascades down rugged rocks into a clear, tranquil pool below. The surrounding landscape, featuring dense tropical foliage and vibrant flora, creates a stunning backdrop for photos and relaxation. Accessible via a short trek, it is an ideal destination for nature lovers and adventure seekers. It takes ±30 minutes to reach from Wapa di Ume Sidemen. Don't miss visiting Bukit Putung afterward.

Songket

Traditional handwoven fabric, often made with intricate patterns and threads of gold or silver. This fabric is a cultural heritage of the region, where skilled artisans like "nenun" by using looms to create these beautiful textiles. Each piece of songket is unique, reflecting the rich cultural and artistic traditions of Sidemen, often used in ceremonial attire and special occasions.



Arak Bali

Arak Bali is a traditional Balinese spirit made from fermented rice or palm sap. Known for its strong flavor and potent kick, it's a key part of local ceremonies and celebrations. This handcrafted liquor reflects the rich cultural heritage and craftsmanship of Bali.



Megibung

is a traditional communal dining practice from Bali, particularly in Karangasem, where a group shares a large meal from a single platter with participants sitting together and eating with their hands. This practice symbolizes togetherness, unity, and mutual respect, fostering strong social bonds.



Tipat Tlengis

Tipat is rice which wrapped in a woven palm/ banana leaf and then boiled until it solidifies into a compact, rice cake-like form steam rice and Tlengis is a processed product of traditional coconut oil making, often used in local dishes such as Tipat Tlengis. If you visit Sidemen, be sure to stop by Tipat Tlengis Ibu Karang, a legendary stall that consistently maintains Balinese culinary traditions.



Mekare - kare / Magaret/ Perang Pandan

A traditional Balinese ritual where men engage in friendly duels using thorny pandanus leaves, symbolizing bravery and unity. Despite the sharp leaves, the event is held in good spirits, with traditional music and a festive atmosphere. This unique tradition showcases the Bali Aga community's deep cultural heritage and attracts visitors eager to witness this ancient and spirited custom.

Interesting facts of Bali's unfure

NYEPI - DAY OF SILENCE

Nyepi marks the first day of the Balinese New Year. It is complete silence without any noise, traffic, fire, and lights. It is a day of complete stillness in the physical and spiritual worlds. Guests are not permitted to leave the premises of the hotel lasts for 24 hour from 6.00 am until 6.00 am of the next morning and the date will be depends on Balinese Calendar. Hindus believe the law concerning Nyepi is "Catur Brata Penyepian" (four ascetic practices). They are "Amati Geni" (no fire, which is both literal and symbolic of mental and physical obstacles), "Amati Karya" (no activities, a precondition to meditation), "Amati Lelungan" (no going out of the house/compound), and "Amati Lelanguan" (no entertainment).

GALUNGAN AND KUNINGAN



Galungan marks the victory of Good over Evil. Balinese all over the island dress in their finest traditional attire visiting their home temples, family temples as well as village temples. This is a day of prayers, thanking the Almighty for his blessings and prosperity to the world. all Balinese homes are busy preparing for the feast. Balinese women are preparing offerings, while men are preparing the typical traditional food, such as lawar (mixed vegetables), babiguling (roasted pig) and other local traditional favorites.

On this day, the locals will set up tall bamboo poles called penjor decorated with young coconut leaves in front of the gate as well as along the entire streets. The entire Galungan festivities ends when all the deities and ancestral spirits return to the heavens on Kuningan Day, falling 10 days after Galungan.

MEPANDES - TOOTH FILING



This ceremony is known as **Metatah** or **Mepandes**, which means "to chisel / carve". Mepandes is one of the mandatory ceremony in a person's life, along with other traditions known as "Manusa Yadnya", which include celebrations of prenatal rites, birth ceremonies, marriage, and cremation. All ceremony are accompanying the Balinese through the different life cycles and phases. The recommended time for this ceremony a person is between 6 to 18 years old, but the perfect time for girls is after their first menstruation. If a person passes away before performing this ceremony, the family will perform the ceremony on the corpse before cremation. In Bali, tooth filing is a cultural procedure as symbolical purpose to reduce 'evil' traits which they refer to as "**Sad Ripu**". The term comes from the Sanskrit words sad (six) and ripu (enemy). Those are desire (kama), greed (lobha), anger (krodha), intoxication or being under the influence of strong emotion (mada), confusion (moha), and jealousy (matsarya).

In that sense it is a way control the evil that is present in a person and create a balance between the evil and the goodness in a human being.

NGABEN - CREMATION

Ngaben is a way to return human to ashes, by cremating or burning. Ngaben is performed to release the soul of a dead person so that it can enter the upper realm where it can wait for it to be reborn or become liberated from the cycles of rebirths. completing the After Ngaben ceremony, the spirit or Atman is freed from the bonds of the material world and is able to unite with Ida Sang Hyang Widhi. The Balinese view the physical body as a transient shell made of earth, air, fire, water, and space that is ultimately meaningless but serves as a container for the immortal soul. When the body dies, the soul moves on to another body (based on the principles of Samsara

reincarnation)



However, there are a few more stages that the soul must pass through before that can happen, and those stages are based on the person's karma from their time spent on Earth. They have the option of going to "Neraka" (hell), "Surga" (heaven), or "Moksa" (oneness with God). The ceremony of cremation is one of many that a soul must complete on its way to Moksa.

CASTE SYSTEM - HIERARCHY OF HINDU SOCIETY

Here are the four castes in Bali from the highest:

The Brahmanas: The Balinese from this caste will always have Ida Bagus (male) and Ida Ayu / Dayu (female).

A man's caste does not change if he marries into the Ksatrya caste, and under certain circumstances, the woman may also be elevated to the Brahmana caste. If a Brahmana man marries a Wesya woman, his status remains unchanged, but the woman keeps her Wesya title. But, it will be another case if a Brahmana woman marries a man from lower castes, she must still relinquish her title.

The Ksatrya, warriors, nobilities and kings.

The Balinese from this caste will always have Dewa Agung, Tjokorda, Anak Agung. A man's caste does not change if he marries into the under certain circumstances, the woman may also be elevated to the Ksatrya caste. It will be same like Brahmana woman, id she marries a man from lower castes, she must still relinquish her title.

The Wesya, the caste of the merchants and administrative officials.

People in this caste always have Gusti, Ngurah, Dewa and Sang included in their name. (Man or Woman rules is same treat as Brahmana/ Ksatrya).

The Sudra, the outsiders, "the jaba" or the commoners.

This caste is dominating the number of populations in Bali by more than 93%. The Sudra do not have such titles to begin their names with. Sudra names begin with the order of birth (the same for male and female): Wayan or Putu if they are the first child, Made or Kadek if they are the second child, Nyoman or Komang if they are the third child, and Ketut (meaning "the last one") if they are the fourth child.

During religious ceremonies or other events in the village/community, the committee will give more respect and special consideration to the higher caste people by providing a designated place to sit.

The Balinese language is also divided into four different levels of politeness: low, medium, high and sacred Bali language. A Sudra will usually communicate with Satria, Brahman or Wesya in high Bali language and the higher caste people usually answer lower caste people in low Bali language to affirm their superiority.

MELASTI



This ceremony is a purification ritual to cleanse the body, mind, and soul of the Balinese people and all sacred statues and objects, including purify The offerings, to them. purification is done with holy water taken from the sea or other sacred sources, which is believed to have the power to cleanse and purify the objects.

In the days leading up to the ceremony,processions of people

carrying offerings and sacred objects on their heads can be seen on the streets, making their way to the beach or other water sources to collect the holy water. The procession is accompanied by gamelan music and chants, creating a vibrant and festive atmosphere.

Once the holy water is collected, it is brought back to the temples where the cleansing ceremony takes place. The Balinese people dress in their finest traditional clothes and offer prayers and offerings to the gods, asking for blessings and guidance. The ceremony is often led by a priest who performs the rituals and blesses the participants.

Overall, the preparations and decorations for the Melasti ceremony are a beautiful expression of the Balinese culture and their strong spiritual beliefs. The ceremony serves as a reminder of the importance of purification and the need to maintain a harmonious relationship with the natural world and the God.

BANTEN - OFFERING

Wherever you go, you will see little baskets on the floor with incense sticks and little goodies such as sweets, fruits and sometimes even some money and a cigarette. The Balinese women are in charge of creating banten in their family; and so this is an essential skill every Balinese female must have, called "Mejejaitan". An offering also can not be presented to the Gods and Goddesses more than once a day. Worshippers are expected to create an offering as beautiful as they can be. Beautiful arrangement is hoped to delight the Gods and Goddess, so that all their wishes may be granted. The Balinese are known for principles of balance and harmony that are applied in many aspects of their lives. Thus, offerings are not only made for the Gods of positive forces ("Bethara" refers to God and "Bethari" is Goddess), but are also crafted for negative forces known as "Butha" and "Kala". Offerings for Bethara Bethari are always presented on a higher platform, while for Butha Kala it will be laid down on the ground.



ODALAN - ANNIVERSARY OF HINDU TEMPLE



Most of the temple celebrate regular schedule of their anniversary commemorating its dedication and a good days. Its held every six months of the Balinese Calendar or every 210 days. The priest will lead by reciting certain holy prayers and occasionally ringing his bell (genta).

After 15 – 20 minutes of the holy man (Jero Mangku) do the offering, people will begin to take flowers. They will wave it above the smoke of the burning incense before tucking it between their fingers while making an adoring gesture with both hands palms together in front of their forehead. The flower will then be placed behind their ears. This ceremony will be repeated multiple times, each time utilizing different color of the flowers. Following the prayer, Jero Mangku will distribute holy water to all the people. After sprinkling the water three times into the palms, people will drink from it and splash the remaining on their face. Finally, all the people will be given a tiny bowl of wet rice to consume and put to their foreheads that symbolizes purity.

- •Kanto Lampo Waterfall: One of the best and most visited waterfall in Ubud, this waterfall offers stunning views with clean water and a little cool atmosphere.
- •**Tegallalang Rice terraces:** One of the most tourist destination for the most beautiful landscape of rice terraces in Ubud.







SACRED SIGHTS TO BESAKIH

Besakih, referred to as the Mother Temple of Bali, is the island's largest and most sacred temple complex. Perched high on the slopes of Mount Agung, it offers sweeping views of rice fields, forested hills, and flowing streams—a setting as spiritual as it is scenic

- •Penglipuran: a beautiful highland village in the regency of Bangli in East Bali, best known for its well-preserved layout and culture. While most of its residents have embraced modernity, its individual compounds are well-kept to look traditional. Manicured gardens line the single stone-paved street that runs through the centre of the village toward the local temple, and age-old arched entrance gates and walls conceal each house.
- **Besakih:** Bali's 'mother temple' a grand complex of at least 86 clan temples and shrines on the south-western slopes of Mount Agung.
- •Kintamani: a village on the western edge of the larger caldera wall of the Mount Batur, this village is the best spot to see the view of Mount and Lake Batur.









HIDDEN HARMONY AT VIRGIN BEACH

- •Tirta Gangga: is a former royal palace in eastern Bali, Indonesia, about 5 kilometres from Karangasem, near Abang. Named after the sacred river Ganges in Hinduism, it is noted for the Karangasem royal water palace, bathing pools and its Patirthan temple.
- **Taman Ujung 'water palace':** with its complete and official designation of Taman Sukasada Ujung, is located in the village of Seraya in Karangasem regency. It's the sister site of Tirta Gangga, also built by the late king of Karangasem.
- •Goa Lawah: is one of Bali's most important temples. It features a complex built around a cave opening that is inhabited by hordes of bats. Its name simply translates to 'Bat Cave'. The temple was established in the 11th century by Mpu Kuturan, one of the early priests who laid the foundations of Hinduism on the island.







ULUWATU'S CLIFFSIDE BEAUTY
